These Practical Guidelines have been compiled to assist parents and boys in the interpretation of the expectations at Christ Church Grammar School (as at June 2021)

	EXPECTATIONS	EXAMPLES OF WHAT IS NOT ACCEPTABLE
WINTER/FORMAL UNIFORM	School Blazer (and House ID Ribbon) to be worn to and from School every day. i. The School jumper may be worn under the blazer but not as an outer garment while traveling to and from School. ii. While at School the blazer may be removed and hung in the locker. iii. After sport training the School tracksuit may be worn home, with the blazer in the School bag.	 Dirty and crumpled blazer. Arriving at school or leaving the School while not wearing the blazer. Wearing the School tracksuit top instead of a jumper or blazer.
	White shirt and School tie. i. The top shirt button must be fastened. ii. The tie is to be done up. iii. Shirt is to be tucked into the trousers.	 Shirt without buttons. Dirty or crumpled shirt. Coloured t-shirt worn under the shirt. Shirt buttons not fastened. Shirt tails outside of the trousers (untucked shirt).
	School grey trousers with a black belt.	 Trousers without a belt. Trousers of a different shade of grey. Dirty, crumpled, or torn trousers.
SUMMER UNIFORM	School white and navy striped shirt. i. Shirt is to be tucked into the shorts.	 Shirt without buttons. Dirty or crumpled shirt. Coloured t-shirt worn under the shirt. Shirt buttons not fastened. Shirt tails outside of the trousers (untucked shirt).
	School navy shorts.	Dirty or torn shorts.
AT ALL TIMES	School navy pullover.	Dirty or torn pullover.Sleeves stretched over the hands.
	School socks (navy with gold stripe).	Sport socks of any kind. Multi-coloured casual socks. Black socks.
	Polished black leather shoes.	 Boots, skate shoes or joggers. Shoes that are not polished. Shoes without laces, with torn, incomplete, or untied laces. Laces other than black.
	Jewellery is not to be worn. No piercings, rings, jewellery, or wristbands are to be worn. i. This applies to any boy traveling to and from School, in School uniform, on a School activity, or whenever the boy is in the School's care unless exempted by the Deputy Principal/Head of Senior School. ii. Watches, important religious and medical symbols are acceptable.	 Rings on fingers, bangles, bracelets, or necklaces. Rings, studs, or sleepers including those through ears or other body parts.
	SHAVING Boys should always be clean shaven with sideburns that finish midpoint of ear.	Moustaches.Sideburns past the midpoint of ear.
	HAIR In keeping with the statement on dress and appearance, hair styles should be clean, tidy, and not grown or groomed above the eyebrows, ears, and shirt collar. It must be of natural colour, worn off the face and should not be able to obtain contrast in length. Hair should not be tucked behind the ears nor need to be tied back in any way to play sport.
